

C&O Canal Lock House Living Tour – A Venture into the pre-1900’s Canal

Experience the C&O Canal history like no one else and live like a lock tender for a night, on Get Out & Go Tours’ newest, and most exclusive tour, the Lock House Living Tour! Enjoy the scenery and highlights of the trail, and spend a summer night in lock house 22, *inside the Park*, on our two-day weekend tour.



Day 1: Shuttle from DC to Point of Rocks, MD. Ride 29 miles from Point of Rocks (mile 48) to Pennyfield Lock (mile 19), where we will over-night in Lockhouse 22. Enroute, you might decide to start by going west 1.5 miles to see Catoctin Aqueduct, one of the newly reconstructed structures on the Canal, before returning and continuing east to

Monocacy Aqueduct, more lock houses, and watered sections of the canal. Enjoy a picnic style lunch at Whites Ferry (mile 35.5) and a cookout dinner at the lock house, with drinks and snacks provided. The lock house is of the mid-period of Canal operation, with an 1880’s décor, and without electricity. The lock house has a port-a-potty outside for your convenience. Picnic style lunch, and a cookout dinner is provided, with drinks and snacks throughout the day. We bring all food, drinks, and bedding materials, for a comfortable over-night stay on this most unique of opportunities.



Day 2: After a cooked and cold breakfast mix, continue riding east another 19 miles to Washington, DC, with optional side trips to Olmstead Island to see the Great Falls of the Potomac River, at Great Falls National Park (mile 14.2), or into Georgetown, DC’s hustle and bustle, before ending your ride at Canal Milepost Zero (mile 0).
